A Paris correspondent of the California Farmer has the following interesting information:—M. Paternon, Director of the Agricultural Station of Genoa, Italy, has made an official report on the products of the manures as distributed by 100 computers at the Vienna Exposition. He deals especially with the phosphates, the salts of potash, and nitrogenous matters. It is satisfactory to learn that of the greater part of our available lands are poor in phosphoric acid, the best of natural phosphates to be everywhere met with are sufficient to meet all the wants of the soil.
