BUILDING ASSOCIATION.—We observe that bills have been posted up around town, calling a meeting on Saturday Evening, January 27, 1866, for the purpose of forming a Building Association, in Mifflintown. A CHEAP ICE HOUSE.—Any one who lives near a water course, at an expense of \$10, can build an ice house, capable of containing a cube of the crystal luxury, ten feet square. Rough boards for the outer wall, slabs for the inner, with a filling a foot thick of tan bark or saw dust, a layer of the same thickness upon the top; lapboard roof; a drain to carry off drippings from the ice, and then pack in the ice close and compact, cover it over with saw dust, and the work is done.—Such a store would furnish half a dozen families with hard butter, cold water, frozen custards and all the luxuries of a first class ice cream saloon, for the whole season.

REMARKABLE OCCURRENCE.—Snake in a Man's Stomach.—The Newville Star of the Valley says that William Hutton, a young man residing in Shippenburg, one day last week, vomited a live snake about 18 inches long and more than half an inch thick! He swallowed it while drinking from a pool in Idaho about four months ago, and has suffered great distress in his stomach ever since, complaining especially of a sensation of coldness. He returned to his home in Shippenburg, expecting soon to die. After undergoing an unsuccessful treatment by a great many medical men, he stated his case to a physician in Philadelphia, who prescribed an emetic, which was taken, with the above result. If came near strangling him, and before he was relieved, he was black in the face.

The conduct of Mr. Eby, since the murder of his wife, has led a great many persons to suspect him of being the murderer himself. Since the death of his wife, he has disposed of various articles, we understand, at considerable sacrifice; and on Monday evening he went to Middleburg for the purpose of having the proper papers drawn up for the sale of his farm. This at once raised suspicions so strong that upon the information of some one he was arrested and lodged in jail.—He was hobbled and handcuffed. He is about 40 years of age, and generally was regarded as a good natured sort of a fellow.—Selingsgrove Times.

PHILADELPHIA MARKETS.

MONDAY, Jan. 23.—Trade continues excessively dull in all departments, but prices generally have undergone essential change. FLOUR AND MEAL.—There is an almost total absence of any demand for shipment, and the only sales reported were 1500 bbls. high grade Ohio extra family on terms kept private. The home consumers purchase sparingly at prices ranging from \$7 25 to \$7 75 for superfine, \$8 to \$8 50 for extras; \$8 50 to \$9 for Northwestern extra family, \$9 50 to \$10 50 for Pennsylvania and Ohio ditto and at higher rates for fancy lots, according to quantity. Rye Flour is but little sought after. We quote at \$5 50 £ bbl Nothing doing in Corn Meal, and prices are nominal.

GRAIN.—The inert condition of the wheat market noticed for some time past, still continues, but prices are unchanged. In the absence of sales to any extent, we quote red at \$1 80 £ 25 for inferior and prime quality, and White at \$2 40 to \$2 70. Bye comes forward slowly, but there is not much demand. Small sales at 90¢ @ \$1 for Southern and Pennsylvania. There was quite an active business done in Corn, at a decline of 1¢ @ 2¢ bush. About 9500 bush yellow were

disposed of at 70¢ bush, in the cars and from store. Oats are quiet but steady at 50¢ @ 51¢, with sales of 3000 bush. at these figures. SEEDS.—There is a fair demand for prime Cloverseed, with small sales at \$7 75 @ \$8 12 1/2, but inferior is dull and neglected. Nothing doing in Timothy, and prices are nominal. Flaxseed is selling in small lots at \$3 15 £ bush.
