Take two quarts of green leeks, pour over them one gallou of oil, and let longer it stands the better. A little benzine subbed over the harness after oiling preparet to do business, and have just reis said to be a sure preventive, but it is not recommended by many on account of the idea that it injures the leather.

One ounce of aloes to one gailon of oil will prevent rats from destroying harness. It is also claimed that by mixing a small quantity, say a tablespoonful of BOYS' READY MADE CLOTHING pine tar to one quart of oil, the harness will be most effectually protected from injury; but if too much is put on, the leather will not absorb it. It will collect dirt, besides making the harness unpleasant to handle.
