The most extraordinary tales are now being narrated by eye-witnesses of the scenes related, and continually finding their way to the public prints, and may one day form a ghastly "literature of the plague." Among those current are the following half-dozen incidents which have gone the rounds of the press, most of them being vonched for, but forming only specimen cases from among the thousands that have occurred :

It finally turned out that he had, with some acquaintances, been indulging in a drunken spree, leaving the relative unburied. In the haste of flight from the city many houses were abandoned, with all their contents, and at once the thieves set up a profitable business by watching their opportunities and carting away all the furniture and other effects.
