SAVING CABRAGE TILL SPRING,-We know of no better way to preserve cabbages through the winter than that which we have recommended for a number of years. It is to plant or set them up in rows as they grow-that is with the roots down-fill in with soil pretty freeley, then make a covering by planting to posts where there is a fence to rest on, or four where there is not allowing for a pitch to carry off the water; lay bean-poles opposite the way of the pitch and covor with corn fodder or straw or boards. In using through the winter avoid as much as possible the sunny side and close up again. We have kept our cabbages for more than a dozen years this way in a perfect state through the winter and into the spring and could even up to the first of May if desirable. Germuntown Telegraph.

WATER-PROOF BOOT SOLES.--If hot tar is applied to boot soles it will make them water proof. Let it be as hot as the leather will bear without injury, applied with a swab, and drying it by the fire. The operation may be repeated two or three times during the winter, if necessary. It makes the surface of the leather quite bard so that it wears longer, as well as keeps the water out. It is a good plan to provide boots for the winter during summer, and prepare the soles by taring as they will then become, before they are wanted to wear, almost as firm as horn, and will wear twice as long as those unprepared.

PRESERVE JARS.-Preserve Jars are hermetically scaled to avoid mould or in other words to keep out invisible germs, which come in with the air and produce mischief. It has long since been found that a plug of cotten makes an effectual closure for a bottle or jar, serving all the purposes of sealing. This agrees with the theory of Tyndall, who has discovered that cotton shifts the air of germs in a peculiar manner of its own.

A Heavy Fall of Snow.

DENVER, Col., Nov. 20.-A severe wind and snow storm occurred here last Thursday, and continued the greater part of Friday. The snow fell to the depth of eight inches, and at Central City ten inches. The storm extended a great distance east and south, and the railroads were all badly blocked up by snow drifts. The telegraph wires on the Kansas Pacific railroad were prostrated. The railroads are now clear, and unless we have a heavy wind will be kept open. Another snow storm last night added about six inches to that already on the ground.

On Friday morning a fire broke out in the barber shop adjoining the Perry House at Kit Carson, and the entire block, including the Perry House, several dry goods and grocery stores, the post-office, two billiard halls, and a number of saloons and dwellings, were destroyed. The loss is estimated at \$100,000, with no insurance The railroad depot and warehouses, containing a large amount of merchandise en route to New Mexico and Arizona, were saved.




