ty of the community in which they In my message to congress one year ago I urgently recommended a reform in the civil service of the country.-In conformity with that recommendation congress, in the ninth section of an act making appropriations for sundry civil expenses of the government and for other purposes, approved March 3, 1871, gave the necessary authority to the executive to innugurate a civil service reform, and placed upon him the responsibility of doing so. Under authority of said act, I convened a board of gentlemen, eminently qualified for the work, to devise rules and regulations to effect the needed reform. Their labors are not yet completed, but it is believed that they will succeed in devising a plan which can be adapted to the great relief of the executive, he heads of departments and members of congress, and which will redound to the true interest of the public service. At all events, the experiment shall have a

I have thus hastily summed up the operations of the government during the laft year, and made such suggestions as occured to me to be proper for your consideration, and submit them with a confidence that your combined action will be wise statemanlike and in the best interest of the whole




