

FARM AND HOUSEHOLD.

WHAT A HEAVY SOIL WILL DO.

The sod makes the corn. This may be taken as an axiom, as undoubted as that a straight line is the shortest distance between two points. If the soil is right the corn can take care of itself. What is wanted is a mass of roots, filling the soil to the depth of three, four, or five inches or more, and such a mass of vegetation on the surface as will inevitably belong to such a mass of roots. Now, what such an amount of vegetable matter, early decomposed, and such as corn leaves to feed upon, would measure, can very easily be estimated. It would certainly be within bounds to say that there would be on every square rod of ground 90 cubic feet of matter equal in fertilizing power to average barn yard manure. This is over three quarters of a cord per square rod; and 160 rods going to make up an acre, there would be over 140 cords of manure to the acre. This amount of barn yard manure would seem perfectly bewildering to a farmer, and would be beyond the power of many to haul out and spread. And here it is, on the spot, in the most perfect shape possible to be utilized. Does it then need any further argument to show clearly that a heavy soil is the best, cheapest, and most easily handled manure a farmer can procure or invent? The vexed question of whether one should plow deep or shallow for corn, here gets a satisfactory and simply reply. With such a sod or any sod, we may say, one must plow sufficiently deep to get enough loose soil on the top to allow the harrow to work and make a seed bed. No more, no less. If our soil is such a one as we lately saw cut from a pasture on a farm in Eastern Pennsylvania, the plow must necessarily go seven or eight inches beneath the surface before enough soil can be obtained which will make a seed-bed. The average crop on this farm is over 100 bushels of shelled corn per acre. And the secret, if there is any in this sod. Why should it be doubted? It is a simple example in proportion; as sod is to soil, so is corn to corn. And by this we may learn what a heavy sod will do.

PLANTING POTATOES.

Dr. Hexamer, of N.Y., gives a result of an experiment of planting potatoes in seventeen different ways, and found the best results were given from one large potato, whole, in each hill; the next best from two large half potatoes, cut lengthwise; next from medium sized potato planted whole; the smallest from small half potatoes. A medium potato in plants whole; large ones cut in half and the largest in four pieces, each lengthwise, always taking care to select the best and soundest potatoes for seed.

J.T. Warder, of Ohio, in an experiment with Hubbards, found that large seed cut in halves give the most salable potatoes. He says: 'This experiment, in connection with one made last year, induce me to cut good sized potatoes for seed in preference to planting them whole; and in years of scarcity to use small potatoes with care not to plant them too closely together.'

Use of Sulphur in Nests.

The powdered sulphur sold by drug gists is a cheap preventive of parasites upon young chickens. After a hen has been sitting till well established, sprinkle a small handful upon her eggs when she is off, and upon every part of the nest and for a little distance all around it. Then when she goes on disturb her feathers, and then dust another handful down to the skin upon her head, neck, and every part of the body not in contact with the nest, and do not omit to put a pinch under each wing. When the chickens are hatched there will be no vermin whatever to leave the hen and gather upon the young, as is frequent by the case when no precautions are taken. One thorough application such as we have described will suffice.

News for Sportsmen.

An exchange says: If the New York correspondent of the Boston Journal can be relied upon there will be flat time made at Long Branch this season. The correspondent writes:

The fastest horse in the world, so it is said, is the English horse Sterling. Private letters have been received here announcing that the famous horse will be shipped for America, and be entered for the Monmouth Cup at Long Branch this season. His competitor will be Mr. Harper's Longfellow. Mr. Harper never solved that his famous horse should never again run for money; but he has consented to have him entered for the cup. The heat, two miles and a half, is regarded as especially favorable to Longfellow. Horsemen believe that with distance he can beat the world. Colonel Tom Scott has agreed to run an express train from Mr. Harper's stables in Kentucky to Long Branch without change of cars. An elegant box stall is to be fitted up with all the modern improvements, and the famous horse will be attended by his old master, who hopes for better luck than when last Longfellow was North.
