

### FARM AND HOUSEHOLD.

#### GROWING POTATOES UNDER STRAW.

In the *Rural New Yorker* of February 3d, 1872, an Illinois correspondent asked if any of the readers of the *Rural* had, the past year, produced a crop of potatoes by dropping the seed on the surface of meadow or pasture land, without plowing, and covering it with straw; and having tried raising potatoes under straw for the last thirty years and more, I will give you a bit of my experience. I did not raise potatoes for some years past without ploughing the ground. I have tried to raise them on sod and on ploughed ground, without covering with ground before I put the straw on, but I had no good crops either way. It will do on sod, or on ploughed ground, if you put plenty of straw on, in a wet season. I never raised a poor crop of potatoes yet, when I first ploughed the ground, then planted them in the same way as I would raise potatoes without putting straw on them. Last year—that is, last summer—was too dry here in Ohio for potatoes, and yet I raised a very good crop of good, large potatoes. I can now show you, if you will come and take a peep into my cellar, potatoes that weigh two pounds and two pounds and a half, of the King of Estates. Early Rose, Peerless, Profic, Mohawk, and a number of other kinds. I will tell you how I raised those large and good potatoes. In the fall of 1870, I ploughed over sod some eight inches deep; through the winter I hauled on a good quantity of barn yard manure and spread it all over the ground; in the spring of 1871, I harrowed the ground, manure and all five; then ploughed the ground again as deep as I had ploughed it before; then harrowed it fine again; then furrowed it out only one way, about three feet apart; then drilled in the seed in the furrows about 10 to 12 inches apart; the seed was some whole potatoes, some cut in halves, and some in less pieces, and some in single eyes; covered them about three inches with ground and hauled the furrows. This was done about the 10th of May, then covered the whole all over with straw from six to eight inches deep and left all the till digging time; then we used the Hexamer six-pronged potato digger in scratching the straw off. We found many potatoes on top of the ground just under the straw.

I have been thus minute in the above, because so many ask me from time to time how I raise potatoes under straw. Now, gentlemen, if the above, will do any one good—and I know it will if you practice it—I shall be glad. Many ask me, too, which kind of potatoes I like best. This last question I will answer. I like the Early Rose best for early, taking yield, quality, beauty, and flavor into consideration. The King of Estates, or "Beesee's Fifty Dollar Potato," as he has it in his essay, is very good; and the Peerless, I think, it decidedly the best and most profitable potato I ever saw for the late. I had it planted side by side with the Peach Blow last season; the Peerless yield double that of the Peach Blow, and is a much nicer potato.—*MICHAEL JACOBY in Rural New Yorker.*

**BUTTER FROM CALIFORNIA.**—The transporting of fresh grass butter from the Pacific coast to New York, by rail is something new, and is likely to become a large business.

A few days ago, a car load of 20, 233 lbs. arrived from San Francisco, consigned to J. S. Martin, corner Chambers and Greenwich Streets, creating quite a sensation among the butter dealers. By the courtesy of R. L. Stuart, Esq., a well known resident of this city—but who, from the note accompanying it, we infer is at present a guest at the Fort William Henry Hotel, Lake George—we are indebted for a handsome cylindrical roll of the new butter, from the first shipment across the continent.—Other shipments are announced; and if the experiment of bringing yellow grass butter, fresh from the Pacific coast, proves as feasible as it seems likely from the satisfactory result of the first shipment, we may expect to get our spring butter in this city much earlier as well as cheaper than heretofore. The color of the California product is all that can be desired, and the flavor quite equal to State butter of a month hence. It costs in San Francisco 30 cents, gold, and the freight is 2 1/2 cents per pound, which leaves the seller in New York a fair profit of 40 cents per pound. It comes in neat 1 lb. cylindrical rolls, each wrapped in cloth, similar to the Philadelphia mode of putting up butter.—*Scientific American.*

**HENS EATING EGGS.**—Build a laying room a little dark, so that they cannot see to do that kind of mischief. Hens naturally like to retire out of sight to lay, in a snug, cozy place. It prevents hens that are laying from being disturbed by going into the house; and straggling hens do not bother, for they cannot see to pick. A room six by eight feet is large enough for seventy-five or one hundred hens; for it will accommodate twenty nests or more. Shelves are necessary to set the nests upon, with a protection in front for the hens to walk on.

**MOKK, OR IMITATION CREAM.**—Beat the white of an egg to a froth; put to it a very small lump of butter, and mix well; then turn it on gradually so that it may not curdle. If perfectly done, it will be an excellent substitute for real cream, either as a sauce for pudding, or in coffee.
