KENTUCKY OUTLAWRY

The Leader of the Underwood Gang Shot. From the Louisville Ledger, May 18. Everybody in Kentucky has heard of the "Underwood gang," the terror of Carter and the neighboring counties in this State. Jesse Underwood was the leader, and he was shot on Tuesday night at the house of Robert Holbrook, in Carter county, under the following circumstances: On Tuesday a stranger stopped at Holbrook's and offered to buy a horse from him. They agreed upon the price of \$100, and the stranger tendered in payment two \$50 bills. Holbrook was suspicious that the money might be counterfeit and refused to take it. The stranger then proposed to take it with him to Olive Hill, or to some neighbor, and he would convince him that the money was all right, but he, having a feud with the Underwoods, feared that this might be a scheme to entrap him and refused to accompany the stranger. As the latter was leaving the place and passing by the stable II's son Charley heard him mutter "that he would be damned if he didn't have that horse that night any way." This threat induced the younger Holbrook and Mr. John Evans to watch that night, and at an early hour two men came to the stable and attempted to get the horse out, but were frightened by Evans and his companion. As they attempted to escape by running they were fired upon by Evans and Holbrook, and one of them fell. This proved to be Jesse Underwood. One ball had struck him under the right shoulder-blade and passed through his body, lodging against the breast bone, and another passed through his right arm. He remained at Holbrook's all night, was a correspondent of the Mayville Eagle, but on the next day was removed by his friends, and his present whereabouts are unknown. Our informant thinks from all he has heard that Jesse's wounds will prove fatal, but we apprehend no such good luck. Wicked as it may seem to speak thus of a fellow man, yet when an individual by his unscrupulous and desperate courses places himself outside the pale of law or mercy, bidding defiance to the one and scorning the other, his death may be looked upon as a public blessing.

A FORTUNE FOUND

scarcely possible for them to tell the exact value of the pieces, but the larger part is gold, the pieces being about the size of twenty dollar gold pieces. It is said furthermore, that Captain Kidd's name was found imprinted on the chest.

TRAVELING STONES

Many of our readers have doubtless heard of the famous traveling stones of Australia. Similar curiosities have recently been found in Nevada, which are described as almost perfectly round, the majority of them as large as a walnut, and of an iron nature. When distributed about upon the floor, table, or other level surface, within two or three feet of each other, they immediately begin traveling toward a common center, and there huddle up in a bunch like a lot of eggs in a nest. A single stone removed to a distance of three and a half feet, upon being released at once started off, with wonderful and somewhat comical celerity, to join its fellows; taken away four or five feet it remains motionless. They are found in a region that is nothing but a bare rock. Scattered over this barren region are little basins, from a few feet to a rod or two in diameter, and it is in these that the rolling stones are found. They are from the size of a pea to five or six inches in diameter. The cause of these stones rolling together is doubtless to be found in the material of which they are composed, which appears to be loadstone or magnetic iron ore.
