

**HELMHOLD'S FAILURE.**

It is evident that Helmholtz's failure was due to great vanity. It is about four years since he was making his greatest dash, and then his career certainly was a remarkable one. He had only been three years in trade in New York, and during that time had made his name famous and had become rich. His income was \$50,000 a year, and all that was required was a continuation of the business which he had established. Instead of this, however, he became an ambitious politician. When Grant was nominated for Presidency, A. T. Stewart advanced \$30,000 toward an election fund. Helmholtz, who had the folly to believe in Seymour's chances, determined to outdo Stewart and consequently advanced \$40,000 to his party. Forty thousand dollars is a large sum of money. It has generally been considered a capital sufficient for many kinds of business. That any man should deliberately throw such a sum away can only be explained by the proud desire to out rival Stewart. Helmholtz is true, expected to make money rapidly, but pride was continually in the way of enduring success. Having outbid Stewart in the political fund, he determined to outdo the Belmonts and Commodore Vanderbilt in equine style, and hence his equipage at Long Branch was the grandest ever seen there, with the single exception of that displayed by Jim Fisk. There was an incessant rivalry between this brace of fools; but in the long run Fisk came out ahead, which might have been expected from his unbridled ambition and vast resources. Helmholtz changed his team every day in the week, but still Fisk excelled him. They have both repaid the reward of their folly, the one living in a dishonored grave while the other is a wanderer in foreign lands.

**FARM AND HOUSEHOLD.**

**OVERGROWN HOGS.**  
There is not one single advantage to be claimed in favor of big hogs. There was never a monster hog which did not make the man who raised him pay for every pound he weighed.  
They do not furnish an ounce of meat gratis, but charge full price for every atom of their carcass. When slaughtered, it takes a long time to get one cool to the marrow in the bone, and then the hams are put in salt, it is troublesome to finish them to the centre. Four hundred pounds, live weight is as large as hog should be, in order to make good bacon.  
Beyond this size there is a loss somewhere. Either the feeder, butcher or consumer is cheated, and as a general thing every one who has anything to do with the big hog will find, if he observes closely, that they are not so profitable as the smooth, nice hogs of 350 pounds weight. A small head, with little upright ears, and legs and ears delicate to perfection, are marks which indicate the greatest amount of flesh for any given amount of food consumed; and will always draw more readily the attention of the butcher.

**Fruit and Berries.**  
Fruits and berries at this season of the year are not only precious luxuries, but the great promoters of health. They act upon the liver, promoting that secretion naturally which many are in the habit of obtaining only by the means of artificial medicines. They thus avert many a disease resulting from a torpid condition of the liver. Another way in which they act beneficially is in the mechanical effect their little seeds produce in passing through the bowels, very much the same as the watering of an irritated eye ball when any hard substance touches that delicate organ, and this water, by dissolving the hardened contents of constipated bowels, keeps them in a healthier state than any pill or purgative invented by the apothecary. There can be no doubt that in the summer and fall seasons people who live mainly on fruits and berries and coarse bread can almost ensure exemption from sickness, while those who eat heartily of solid meats and vegetables two or three times a day are liable to all the diseases that flesh is heir to.

When your strawberry beds are done bearing, now the vines off with a scythe, not too close, and allow the vines to lay as a mulch or protection against the fierce suns of July and August. Of course the vines should be spread evenly. We have found it in our own practice to be very successful in protecting the stools and in giving them a chance to start vigorous new vines to meet the winter trials.

For a SPRAIN.—Wet the injured part with a flannel dipped in hot water, or if the sprain is very painful, wet the flannel with laudanum and cover the whole with a dry cloth. Then, with the arm in a sling if it be the wrist that is sprained, or the leg in a horizontal position if it be the ankle, wait and see if it will be necessary to send for the doctor.

A balky horse, it is said, can be perfectly managed by placing your hand over the horse's nose and shut off his wind until he wants to go, and then let him go. So says one who states that he has long tried it. The remedy is simple always at hand, and a merciful one to the beast and can be easily tested.
