

FARM AND HOUSEHOLD.

Dissolving Bones. W. H. W. Reading, Mass. in Horticulturalist, says: "My mode of doing this is very effective. I have a large water-tight hoghead standing out doors near the kitchen. In the spring I cover the bottom about six inches deep with dry soil. On this I put a layer of bones about the same depth, and cover them entirely with unleached ashes. On these another layer of bones, then ashes, and so on till the hoghead is full. I have it then exposed to the rains all summer and winter, until the next spring. Then on removing the contents of the hoghead, I find nearly all the bones so soft they will crumble to powder under a very slight pressure, and mixed with the ashes and soil, they give me a nice little pile of most valuable manure, ready for immediate use. Any of the bones not sufficiently rotted, I return to the hoghead again for another twelve-month's slumber. In this way I have had no difficulty in transforming all the bones I can get into bone meal. I buy them directly from the butcher at a dollar a hundred pounds, for the purpose of thus converting into manure and consider them the cheapest fertilizer I can obtain."

Sowing Clover in August. A correspondent of the Western Farmer, writing from Adams county, Wisconsin, says: "I have lived twenty years in this region and have raised clover here for sixteen years of the time. I have sown seed in mid winter on the snow, in the spring, and have had the seed fail in all the seasons, except sown in the month of August. I now settle down upon the opinion that this is the proper time to sow the seed, more especially in this climate, as three years out of four we have a drought between April 20, and the 1st of July, lasting many times, for months, and entirely ruining out the grass that springs from winter or spring seeding. These droughts are not so common in the eastern states, where spring sowing may do well. My mode is to sow in the month of August and put no crop with the seed, except it is for protection. When sown after raising a crop of oats, enough oats will come up from the stubble for protection. Corn is a sure crop for clover to catch with if sown before the clover; even then I should sow oats with the seed.

Save Your own Cloverseed. We have just been informed says the Franklin Patriot that one of the largest and enterprising farmers of this county, last year, saved enough clover seed for his own sowing, sold enough to pay for all the dry goods used in his family, and received \$25 in cash in addition. This is the way in which he did it. He put a wire bottom in a trough in which he fed his stock—the wire being two or three inches above the close bottom of the trough. The stock in pulling the clover hay from the racks would scatter the seeds almost pure through the wire into the receptacle below. How easy and simple a way to save hundreds of dollars, now annually sent out of the country. This can be done also by making close floors in your barn lots. This will be somewhat more expensive, but it will pay for itself in one season.

YELLOWS ON PEACH TREES.—At a Fruit Grower's Convention in Muskegon Mich., Feb. 1, Mr. Nowlen is reported to have given the following as a specific remedy for yellows in peaches: It was to dig down two feet to the roots of the tree affected, throw on a handful of hot water, besprinkle it plentifully with ashes and fill the hole in again. It is believed that the cause of the disease is erected by a fungus growth at the roots. The Benton Harbor people were confident that the boiling hot water and the ashes were an effectual cure. The symptoms of the disease were a premature ripening of the fruit, the yellowish cast of the leaves, and a peculiar spiral wavy growth of twigs from the branches. This might occur also from the borer.

Plowing in California.—The immense wheat fields of California are plowed with gang plows. Eight horses draw a plow, which turns seven furrows at the same time, and which will plow eight to ten acres per day. One farmer has with five such teams and plows, all his own, plowed and seeded four thousand acres of land. A seed sower is fastened ahead of the plow, the grain is sown, and the plow covers it. This is on light land. On heavy land the work is slower. The plowman in California does not "put his hand to the plow," but rides, and "his works do follow him."

BEST-ROOT SUGAR.—The Sugar-Maker's Journal, a French publication, states that best root sugar is known only by name in America, and that Americans have never been able to introduce into their country an industry which has spread so wonderfully over all the northern part of Europe. It is strange that a paper devoted to a specialty should know so little about its condition in this country, when the fact is, that in five States at least, best-root sugar is successfully and profitably manufactured, and that the business is now limited only by the amount of roots raised.
