Raising Chickens.

I desire to write what I know of raising turkeys and chickens. The recipes given for curing chickens of the gapes, such as the whites of eggs, corn meal with pepper, wheat soaked in turpentine, and a number of others, are of little if any value. The gapes in chickens are caused by small worms getting into the windpipe. I have raised thousands upon thousands of chickens, bought and sold chickens, and believe that gapes is a contagious disease, for my chickens never had them until I bought strange chickens. I have tried many cures, and there are none that amount to anything except the horse hair. By inserting the horse hair in the chicken's windpipe you draw the small red worm out, and this at once relieves the chicken and the gapes are cured.

In regard to raising turkeys, the best plan is to feed them on milk made into a cheese with wheat and salt screenings. In time of rain keep them in the dry, but when they get wet they get drugged and die. Corn meal I have tried, and upon a clear examination I find that it does not agree with them, and in many instances kills them. Old turkeys I think do best out in the cold on trees, rather than in sheltered places. Let every farmer be cautious of what he feeds his young turkeys until they are eight or ten weeks old. After this period they will know what to eat. I know that the foregoing is correct, for I have tried many plans, and experience is always the best guide. Reading Gazette.

Try Walnut Leaves.

The fly, insignificant as it is in size, and devoid of the power of doing any great harm, is one of the most annoying little pests of all the insect tribe. A nuisance to man, the fly is the terror of horse, whose flesh is made to quiver whenever the foot of one touches him. It is therefore, an act of humanity to come to the aid of the horse, powerful as he is, against his nimble assailant, the fly. Here is a recipe, which is said to be an excellent defence against it. At all events, a trial of it will not involve much expense, nor will it do harm, should it prove unavailing as a defence to the horse.

Take two or three small handfuls of walnut leaves, upon which pour two or three quarts of cold water; let it infuse one night, and pour the whole next morning into a kettle and let it boil a quarter of an hour; when cold it will be fit for use. No more is required than to moisten a sponge, and before the horse goes out of the stable, let those parts which are the most irritable be smeared over with the liquor, viz: between and upon the ears, the neck etc. Not only the lady or gentleman who drives out for pleasure will derive benefit from the walnut leaves thus prepared, but the coachman, the wagoner and all others who use horses during the hot months.

The periodical liming of fruit trees is generally considered as serviceable, especially in keeping down the ravages of the insects which find their home in the fissures of the bark. It is also important that the operation should be likewise extended to the main branches. For the purpose in question, white wash has generally been used, causing a decided whiteness of the tree, which is objected to by many persons on the score of the unwholesome appearance and the readiness with which the lime becomes detached. It has been shown, however, by experience, that the same beneficial effects result from the use of colorless lime-water, which every one knows how to prepare with unskilled lime, and which, when settled becomes clear, and can be poured off and used as above indicated. In this way repeated applications can be made without affecting the appearance of the tree. -American Farm Journal.

CURE FOR A HORSE FALLING AT HALTER. -A year ago I had a four-year old mare which had contracted the habit of pulling back whenever she was fastened. She would be sure to break loose if what held her could be broken by her drawing in such a backward way. She was cured of the habit by taking a rope two feet long, fastening one end around her body just back of her shoulders, and passing the other end through the ring of the halter and tying to the post. She lay back for her usual pull, but soon found she was drawing from her body instead of her head, which she did not relish, and soon gave it up entirely. She can now be left anywhere with perfect safety, as nothing will induce her to pull back when fastened. -Cor. of Country Gentleman.

COPPERAS is the cheapest, as well as one of the most effectual disinfectants known, and its application is simple and perfectly safe, with this precaution, that it should not be kept in a metal vessel, unless of lead. Mixed in the proportion of one pound of copperas to eight quarts of water, and when thoroughly dissolved poured down drains, sinks or water-closets, it will at once remove the most obnoxious smell. No family stable, provision shop or slaughter house should be without a supply, and cities would be wise to order its use in sprinkling the streets of unhealthy localities, as is practiced in London.

The seed farms of Collins, Downs & Co., (near Haddonfield, N. J.) embrace over 200 acres of highly cultivated land. There are two farms, a mile apart, to prevent the mixing of the different varieties of the same seed. There were 33 acres of turnips in seed last year, yielding about 20,000 pounds of seed.
