Letters from the Fifth Regiment.

Barra Goun, Co. Jackson, 2 January 12th, 1847.
Dear Parents—Having called your boy home that I can call my own, I hasten to give you the good news by writing to you. I at this moment am writing from my tent, with my knapsack for a desk, and Ruggie, Hamilton, Drum, Sewal, Keane and Jones, sitting around me. I was on guard last night, and never in my life passed so disagreeable a time. A cold, north-west wind, accompanied with a heavy rain, made at least 100 inches deep, and to be compelled to march for four successive hours, you can easily imagine what a kind of state I am in.

After leaving old Pitt, I began to feel as a soldier, from a man into a dog, but if ever a dog were such a master well so will I serve my country. Our food consists of Bacon, Pork, Beans, Biscuit and Coffee.

As you know, the Killers and Boaters were our companions from Pittsburg to New Orleans. They were very quiet, and behaved themselves in an orderly and peaceable manner. We arrived at Cincinnati on Christmas day, but were prevented by Col. Wray from going on shore, a privilege which was refused to us.
