Thirteenth Congress—First Session.

Correspondence of the Morning Post.

Washington, March 14, 1888.

SEVENTY—The House bill providing for a loan of \$16,000,000, together with the one making an appropriation for deficiencies, was reported to the Senate, with amendments, which covered the expenses of Mr. Sewer to Mexico as Commissioner.

On motion of Mr. Mangum, the Senate went into executive session, and confirmed the nomination of Mr. Sewer as Commissioner of Mexico.

When the doors were opened, Mr. Atchison moved to take up the Deficiency Bill.

Mr. Cass moved to lay it on the table, and took up the Foreign Bill.

Mr. Webster and the question pending when the executive session commenced, had the precedence, and should be decided, before proceeding to act on the Army Bill.

Mr. Hannegan was then appointed Chairman of the Committee on Foreign Affairs, in place of Mr. Sewer.

On motion of Mr. Borah, the Senate went into executive session, and continued until the adjournment.

House.—Went into Committee of the Whole on the bill to establish a national collection districts in Louisiana, which was passed.

On motion, the Message of the President, relating to the correspondence which had led to the appointment of Mr. Sewer to proceed to Mexico on the part of the Executive.

Mr. Hannegan took the floor in defence of the Administration. At the close of his remarks.

Mr. Root obtained the floor, and the House adjourned.
