Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Represent totives of the United States of Ametea in Congress assembled, That from and after the passinge of this act, there shall be created a new executive depart-ment of the government of the United States, to be called the Department of the Interior; the head of which department shall be called the Secretary of the Interior, who shall be appointed by the President of the United States, and who shall hold his office by the same tenure, and receive the same salary, as the Secretaries of the other executive departments, and who shall perform all the dufies assigned to him by this act.
