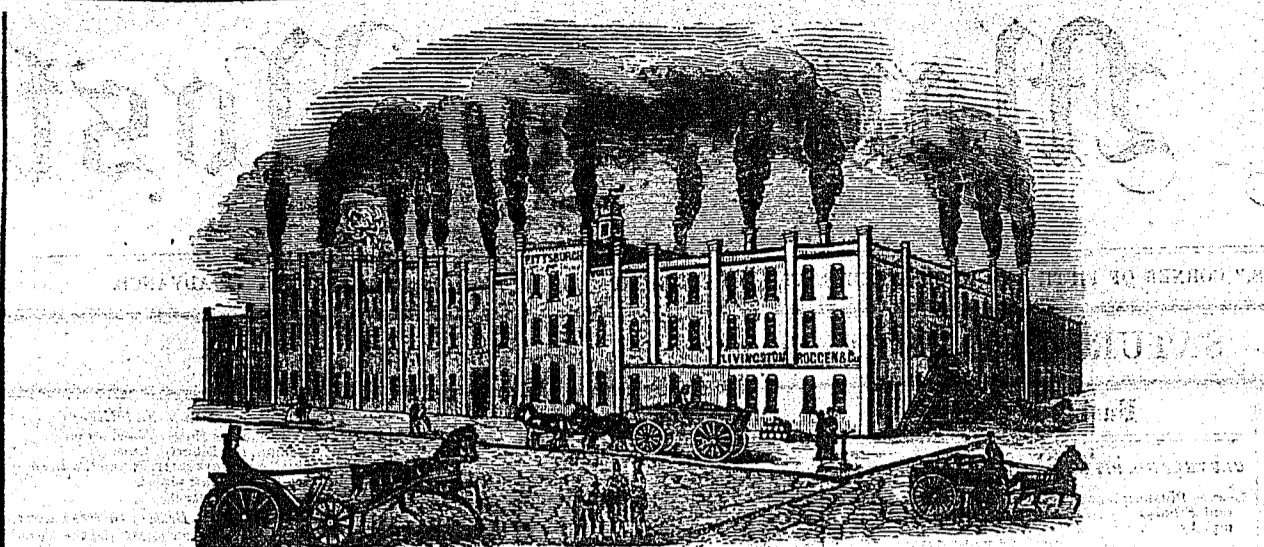

Next we were taken through a large room where the work of fitting and putting the locks together was going on. Here every man has a particular part to perform, and every man is engaged in his work with regularity as clock work. In this room three men are constantly engaged in assorting the various pieces of castings, and taking them to the marks and setting them in place.

On the 2d floor is another large room, where a considerable number of men are employed in finishing coffee mills and counter scales. The work is done with great care and precision, and the finished articles are of the highest quality.
