XXXIII CONGRESS—FIRST SESSION.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 20. The President presented a petition praying for an increase in the duty on foreign imported cigars. It is not much.

Messrs. Hunter and Brodhead presented various papers, relating to the bridge over the Ohio at Wheeling.

Mr. Hunter said he desired to present the memorial of thirty-six members of the Legislature of Pennsylvania, stating that the Wheeling Bridge is not such an obstruction to the navigation of the Ohio as to render it a nuisance; and praying Congress to protect it. It is said that he had no doubt petitions would be presented from Ohio and Virginia, asking that it be protected, by making this bridge a toll route.
