XXIII CONGRESS—FIRST SESSION

Washington, March 9. The House of Representatives met at 10 o'clock, and the Speaker, Mr. Schuchert, presided. The Journal of the previous day was read and approved. A petition for the restoration of the freedom of the public lands, presented by Mr. Woodworth, and a resolution of Mr. Bond, were taken up.
