

River Installations, etc.

The following are the dimensions of the installation:—The hull is 276 feet long, 28 feet wide, 20 feet deep, 6 feet draft; extreme length, 308 feet; diameter of wheels, 86 feet. The hull was built by S. Fring of New Orleans. The cylinders are 65 inches in diameter, and 4 feet 6 inches long. There are four boilers, 42 inches in diameter, and 30 feet long. There is also a smaller boiler and engine, for the purpose of hoisting freight. The engine was built by John Snowdon, of New Orleans. The cabin was built by Messrs. & Denting of this city, and is about 100 feet long, and contains 50 large state rooms, over 6 feet wide. The painting was done by James Spier, of New Orleans. The installation was furnished by J. W. Woodruff.

The Illinois is intended to run between Louisville, St. Louis and New Orleans, under the command of Captain Strawn; Mr. James Kinn, Jr., goes out as first clerk.

It appears to be very plenty in this city at present. Large quantities of merchandise are arriving daily from the East, and it is expected that the boats from the West will bring heavy cargoes of bacon, sugar and molasses.

Stenhouse and Pittsburgh City of Packer.—This is a dispute in which considerable attention is being given to the case. The Herald says that "as Stenhouse furnishes the majority of the coal and shipping in the trade, it is deemed politic for her to get up through the assistance of Pittsburgh, a daily line of packets between the two points." The matter will deserve the attention of capitalists here, as the advantage which would derive from this formation of a line would be great, especially as the Herald remarks, during the completion of the Pittsburgh and Steubenville Railroad.

The Steubenville people do not like the idea of Wheeling receiving the credit of this trade, and at the same time losing credit as a city. The trade is very profitable, and, if the line was once established, would pay good dividends.

The Streets.—The time was when we had Street Commissioners in Pittsburgh, but we are apprehensive that they have passed away, with many other old things that were formerly useful. Report, however, says that someone who still exists, but is contradicted by the citizens and business men of Fifth Street between Market and Southside. They say that if there was a Street Commissioner in the city, the immense amount of dirt and filth that has been accumulating for months past in that quarter, would have been removed long ago. We understand that a petition will shortly be presented to the Council, praying them to appoint some person to attend to the matter.
