*Doris' George, and Highway Robbery.* — A most daring outrage was perpetrated on Tuesday night near the outer depot of the Pennsylvania Railroad. A French physician, named Alphonse Blum, arrived in the city in the morning, and was staying at the Depop. Hotel, near the ticket office of the railroad. He walked on Tuesday evening, about 10 o'clock, he walked out of his room to within about forty yards of the outer depot; he noticed two men walking a short distance before him—also another man, who came up to him from a different direction, and spoke to him, asking him what time it was; he took out his watch and told the stranger, who then asked him whether he had any money, to which he replied that he had not. The ruffian then struck Mr. Blum, knocking him down, and then struck him again. He then took out Mr. R.'s mouth, and then tied his hands to a tree. The other men, who had come up by this time, assisted the first rascal to tie him with a rope, around the throat, to the tree. The men then stripped Mr. Blum of his clothing, hat, coat, pants, vest, and shirt—leaving his shoes and stockings even; in his coat was a red morocco pocket-book, which contained several papers of value, and a number of surgical instruments of French make. They also took his pocket-book, which contained \$76, mostly in gold, and also open his small silver-lipped watch; after taking the clothes, they left Mr. Blum tied to the tree by his hands, which passed across his mouth, gagging him; he was also tied by the throat and feet, with ropes, and his hands tied behind him. In this position the villains left Mr. R., and he remained tied to the tree until about five o'clock yesterday morning, when he was released by some one passing, and conveyed to doctor's office, where he was treated. His clothes were never applied. He made no information hereafter. Physicians, yesterday morning, informed us that he had been shot.
