JULY 21.—*Post Office.*—In Allegheny City, when the new postoffice is completed, the gas will be applied to connect it with the lower part of the post office, which is situated at the head of the hill, paid at the office of the Company within five days after presentation.

Art Dealer.—A woman named Mary Taylor, a resident of Allegheny City, was bound over by the Mayor yesterday, to appear at Court and answer a charge of assault and battery preferred against her by Matilda Wylie, who was a victim to Mary's violence.

Selling Liquor.—The keeper of a drinking house on the Fourth street road, named Fyfoyle, was arrested yesterday, and fined \$8 by the Mayor, under an act of Assembly of 1884, for selling liquor to a minor.

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Something Noted.—We see that when we have had a further hearing yesterday, on a charge of larceny preferred against him by Ann Greenough, was remanded by the mayor, as the prosecution did not appear. It will have a hearing on Friday next.
