From the first of July, 1850, to the same date, 1852, a duration of two years, there were imprisoned in the county joil, 5,221 persons, by our city magistrates, for yagrancy and drunkenness. The Sheriff of the county is allowed ten cents per day for furnishing food for these degraded beings, and, as the average term of confinement is about seven days, we have an expenditure during that term of \$3,654 70 for food, for these persons.
