The census returns of the county, represent it in a condition that is gratifying to the inhabitants.

The entire population of the county on the first day of June, 1890 was 44,224.

Of these 26,461 were natives of Pennsylvania, 8,464 were natives of other States, and 2,007 were foreigners.

The ratio of foreigners to the whole population is a little over 4 1/2 per cent.

In the United States the ratio is 11 1/2 per cent.

The colored population amounting to 15,000 or about 33 per cent.

The number of deaths during the year ending June 1st, 1890, was 410—two per cent.

There is a death to every 102 inhabitants.

The ratio in the United States is 16.25—two per cent.

This speaks well for the health of Washington county.

The Memphis (Tenn.) Whig states that since the 1st of September, 1892, up to July 18th, 1893, over two hundred thousand bales of cotton have been shipped from that point.
