Union of the Cincinnati Packet Line and the Union Line.—The negotiations between the directors of the Union Line of steamboats and the Cincinnati Packet Line, which were combined daily line from Pittsburgh to St. Louis, have been concluded, and the contract for the consolidation entered into. Its main features are as follows:—

The line between Pittsburgh and Louisville to be composed of five boats, five of which are to be operated by the Cincinnati Packet Line, and five by the Union Line. The boats of the Cincinnati Packet Line are to be operated by the Union Line, and vice versa.
