WEEKLY MONEY MARKET.

Money matters remain about the same as at the date of our last weekly report.

High rates of interest will be likely to prevail hereafter.

And railroad stocks and municipal bonds are in little demand.

It is not probable a favorable time for the sale of the High Yield of the Pennsylvania public works.

But that that line of works is worth more than the minimum price demanded cannot be doubted.

The first payment of \$20,000,000 in cash will require two millions or more in bonds.
