Decision in the supreme Court. PHILADELPHIA, December 21. In the Sa-preme Court of Pennsylvania, to-day, Justice Biack delivered an opinion in the case of Von gages and Judg Swartin vs. the Commonwealth of Pen error from Allegheny county. The case was error from Allegheny county. In the case was summary conviction for selling spirituous liquors in the Sabbath, and a penalty of \$50 had been imposed by the Alderman. The defendant claim-ed the right of trial by jury and denied the ju-risdiction of the Alderman. Judge Birok affirm-ed the judgment of the magistrate, and in ex-planation of the law said that cases like this wave not white at common law but criminal prowere not suits at common law but criminal pro adings under a special act.

ceedings under a special act. The same judgment was readered by the Court in several other similar cases from Allegheay. Judge Lewis dissented and argued against the whole principle of summary conviction. Trial by jury was designed by the public security and all summary convictions were invasions of its provisions. To authorise a justice to impose a fine of \$50 and imprison for non-payment with no appeal to a jury was an effectual and plain abolition of trial by jury; a right which it was a privilege of every citizen to claim.
