The world is now perfectly enabled to appreciate those curious details by which the remarkable Brussels pamphlet, attributed to General Prince Napoleon, makes clear to demonstration that the mischievous inactivity at Varna, while the brave Moussa Pasha fought a giant's fight in battered Silistria—and the safe retreat of the beaten Russians—and the Dauubian principalities played over into the hands of Austria—and the untoward expedition to the Orimea—originated, all of them, not in any strategioal combination directed against England's enemy, but originated in the wish of distancing the war from the frontiers of Hungary.
