AMERICA ABOARD—ITS MISSION AND INFLUENCE.

The United States seems destined to accomplish directly or indirectly, many reforms in the policy, customs and conditions of the eastern world. It was one of the first nations to protest against the levy of a tribute on all Mediterranean commerce by the Barbary Corsairs. For a century or more all commercial nations paid an annual tribute to the government of Algiers. Even the English nation submitted to it for years, until its ships could no longer afford to pay the strength of their armaments, and constant readiness for battle. This tribute was a sort of legalized piracy; the piratical corsair came to anchor under the guns of the nation against the formation of our government, our ships were subjected for a time to the same plunder, and the annual tribute was demanded. But it was refused, and a few of our ships being seized and plundered, a strong naval force was sent out to punish the pirates. It accomplished the task most brilliantly and successfully; by the destruction of the Corsairs' ships, and the bombardment of one of their chief cities. Since, American ships have been free to cruise unimpeded over all parts of the Mediterranean. Our example was soon followed by other nations, and the Barbary Corsairs disappeared.

There still exists in one part of Europe a long-enduring custom of tribute-paying to a powerful nation. In the year 1806, the French government has given notice that it will no longer allow, so far as merchant ships are concerned, all such vessels entering the Baltic sea are compelled to pay to the Russian government a tribute of \$1,000,000. This tax is a violation of the principle of the Danish flag, that commands the whole seaboard, and has been examined and taxed according to the value of the cargo. The tax must be paid, or the ship cannot proceed. This tax on commerce amounts to nearly a million dollars a year, and forms an important item of the revenues of the Danish government. Why this tax is demanded on one can tell. The Danish custom is not new. It has existed for ages, and its origin is not far to be traced. It is a relic of the "immemorial time," and depends for its existence and allowance, like many other old usages and customs, upon the power of the nation that exacts it.
