land. HIS DYING SPEECH. The Cleveland papers give detailed accounts of the execution at that place, on Friday last, of Parks, found guilty of the murder of Beatson.

The Herald says:

"Of the attempt of Parks to commit suicide by cutting his throat yesterday, our readers were fully informed. The efforts of Drs. Strong and Cleveland to prevent the flow of blood, and to revive him by stimulating drinks, were successful, and he was so chained that he was almost powerless. He expressed strong regrets that he had been prevented from succeeding in his attempt to destroy himself, and was very bitter to him deaponds tions of Mr. Reswerth the faller attempt to desiroy nimeer, and was very bitter in his denunciations of Mr. Bosworth, the jailor, for his speedy and resolute action in the matter. He soon grow milder, and seemed resigned to his fate, speaking often and in affectionate terms of his wife and child, and of his counsel, and Sheriffs Soward and Spangler. He gradually grew stronger, and passed a quiet night, sleeping five or six hours. This morning he was ing hve or six nours. He wished to be shaved, but the Sheriff did not think it safe. His shirt was charge t, and at six minutes before twelve he was torno to the scaffold by Sheriff Spangler, Deputy Bos-worth, and United States Marshal Fitch, and placed in a chair, being fastened to it by a ropo passing round his waist. The scaffold was crected by J. M. Blackburn, and placed in the hall of the jail. It had a platform about eight feet by four or five feet in size, elevated about eighteen inches from the ground.
