THE CRIMEA AND POLAND. The possession of the Crimea gives to Russia the preponderance in the East, in fact, of the Black Sea; and the strong fortress and magazine of Sebastopol are a perpetual menace to the Turkish Empire. The conquest of that fortress and of the Crimea guarantees for the time the empire of the East, and the vessel would more effectively assist first, all the work of the Crimea, and secondly, all the work of the Black Sea. A MONSTER CONING. Defense, in his "Household Words" of May 10th, gives an account of the trial of the vessel, "the T. H. B.," which was built at London. The length of the vessel, it is said, is six hundred and eighty feet, or more than twice the length of any steamer now afloat. The hull is to be twenty-five thousand tons, nearly six times as large as that of any ship now in existence. It is believed by its projectors that this steamer will be able to make the trip from Liverpool to New York and back again in two weeks, and from Liverpool to Australia in three weeks. It is designed to run in the Australian trade, but will make its first or trial trip next Spring, between Liverpool and New York. It will have good accommodations for four thousand passengers—two thousand of the first class, and two thousand of the second; and as a transport ship it could carry with reasonable comfort nearly ten thousand souls at once. Its breadth on deck will be over one hundred and thirty feet.

THE OHIO AND INDIANA RAILROAD. The Ohio and Indiana Railroad, which was chartered in 1847, has been reorganized and is now being constructed. The line will run from Toledo, Ohio, to Indianapolis, Indiana, a distance of 300 miles. The first section of the line, from Toledo to Sandusky, Ohio, has been completed, and the second section, from Sandusky to Toledo, is now being constructed. The line will be completed in 1860.
