Governor Reeder's Alleged Speculations in Indian Lands. Letter from Gov. Reeder to Secretary Maroy. SHAWNEE MISSION, K. T., June 20, 1855. H.A. W.M. L. Marcy, Secretary of State, Washington: Sin: As I promised in my brief note of the 20th inst., from New York, I avail myself of the first opportunity to reply to your letter of the 12th. That letter mentions as causes of complaint against me in the opinion of the Presi-dent, "purchases of Kansas half breed reservations made by me in the Territory of Kansas," and also "other speculations in the lands of Kaness, apparently in violation of Acts of Con-gress and of regulations of the Departments;" and at the same time invites any explanation which I may desire to give in regard to the character and extent of the transactions above referred to, and particularly the matters re-ferred to in the letter of G.
