The undersigned, your memorialists, members of the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Kansas, respectfully represent that a crisis has at length arrived in the office of the Territory which makes is imrepresent that a crisis has at length arrived in the affairs of this Territory, which makes it imperative that you should interpose, so that our doverment (the wheels of which have been dragging so heavily heretofore, and which have at last come to a stand,) may be relieved of the clog which has been attached to it, and be enabled to move once more in its regular course.
