This cannot be borne. All agree that if the Sub Treasury plan is to be engrated upon our National system of Finance (as it now partially is, at least in the Post Office Department of the public service) there must be the least possible increase of Revenue on hand.

We propose a re-coinage and establishment of the rates as follows: Under 50 miles 5 cents; under 200 miles 10 cents; under 300 miles 15 cents; under 1,000 miles 20 cents; over 1,000 miles 25 cents.

By these rates, a letter sent from New York to Bangor, Maine, is charged just as much as if sent to Natchitoches, Jefferson Barracks, or Prairie du Chiou, County, in the same State where mailed.
