

Resumption.—The first section of the bill as passed on second reading by the House, 67 to 23, is as follows:

"That the banks of the Commonwealth be and they be hereby ordered and required to resume specie payments for all their obligations, whether in notes, deposits, or other liabilities, on or before the fifteenth day of February eighteen hundred and forty, and continue the payment of the same until a special agreement is made between the directors and the banks, which shall be affected by the passage of this act."

The Telegraph of Wednesday is of opinion that the bill will become a law, and the city papers of Thursday mention a rumor that it has actually passed on third reading.

The Germans are Coming!—The German Argonauts, a characteristic of our Bremen population. Several honest Loos German farmers started in company with loads of what from Columbia county, for Marillon, in Stark county, to raise money to pay their taxes. The best offer they could get was 43 cents, 3 months' credit. Obligated to get money, they drove back with their wheat through Columbia county, to the Beaver Falls, where they made sale for cash. They turned homeward in a body, each with his coat turned inside out, and being asked why they did so, replied, "be sure we'll show you at the next election."

The "next election" will show?—They will vote for Harrison, Tyler, and Reform! They go for a change of government officers, and against the executive misrule of Martin Van Buren.

The Sub-Treasury Bill.—We noticed last week that the sub-treasury bill had passed the U. S. Senate. The vote was 24 to 18, consequently a minority vote, and if the states had been fairly and fully represented, it would have been thrown out. For instance, if Wright, of N. Y., Smith, of Conn., Rogers, of Va., Norvell, of Mich., had expressed the wishes of their respective legislatures by their vote, it would have stood 32 against, to 20 for. Webster, of Mass., Tallmadge, of N. Y., and the Delaware, Virginia, and Michigan, vacancies, all of which are sure to be the Whigs would have made 27 votes against it, being a clear majority of the whole Senate vote!

The focus in their debates on this bill, have by their leaders shown, the true object of the party in power. It is to reduce the price of labor in this country to a level with that of the European governments: to graft the remnants of the old feudal system of vassalage on our native soil, and in their own devious to grasp the bubble of an exclusive metallic currency, to bring distress and misery on the laboring classes. If this scheme be brought into operation, it must be "in spite of lamentation," and the evils to ensue can never be estimated, except in the hard school of experience.

The Harrisburg Nominations.—Both the nominees have addressed letters to a committee of the National Convention, signifying their acceptance of the respective nominations. Gen.
