Yeas 102, nays 23, the democrats generally refusing to vote.

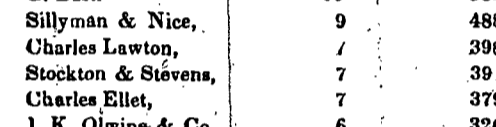
