

GOVERNOR PORTER'S LETTER.—The following is the letter of Governor Porter to the family of the late President, written agreeable to a resolution of the Legislature.

EXECUTIVE CHAMBER, Harrisburg, April 7, 1841. To the Family of William Henry Harrison, late President of the United States.

I have the honor to be informed by your obedient servant, DAVID R. PORTER.
