IRON CARAL BOATS .- The substitution of iron in the place of wood, in the building of ships, steambats, and even houses, in point of real economy, durability, strength, and every desirable quality, is found to exceed the most sanguine expectation Canal boats constructed of this mysluable materia have been for many years in use in England; and long experience has proved them to be superior in every respect to those constructed of wood. A friend has kindly permitted us to publish the follow

### Extract from a letter, calea

CABDIFF-South, Wales, April, 1841. "The cost of an iron and a wooden canal boat of the same outside dimensions, would be about the same, say £170 to £180. The durability would be in favor of the tron one, if we take into account the wear and tear, and the repairs necessary in consequence. The draught of water of an iron boat would be considerably less than a wooden one, and an iron boat never increases its draught, whilst a wooden one does by the wood absorbing the water. The comparison between a wooden and an iron boat, of the same outside dimensions, for capacity of burthen, is 20 per cent in favor of the iron boat. The friction against the sides of the canals would be in proportion to the draught of water."

### Extract from a letter, dated

STAFFORDSHIRE, (Eng.) May, 1841. "The cost of a wooden boat, of 25 tons burthen, is here about £120, that for an iron bost I cannot ascertain, as none bave been made here for many years past, and there are only six in use out of 350 employed on the canal. Those iron boats in use are about 25 years old; but I cannot ascertain the cost of repairs of them during that time. The iron boat will carry about 3 tons more on the same draught of water, as wooden ones by the latter will draw about 2 feet, 4 inches. Iron and wooden boats are much the same in their effects on canal banks.

"There can be no doubt of the superiority of locomotives on canal banks (if the locks are few and far between) over steam tugs in drawing boats, as the wash from the paddle wheels would injure the banks most materially, and are in consequence never allowed in this country. It is thought that the Archimedian screw would remedy that difficulty.

"It is necessary that iron boats should have wood en fenders outside, to prevent the rivets from being rubbed off."


