A T the request of the Commissioners, the following legal provisions recently enacted, and now in force, are inserted for the information of the taxable inhabitants of the several Boroughs wards and townships in the county of Schuvlkill Act passed 11th June 1840: Section 2 .- ' The County Commissioners shall be and and hereby authrorized and required annually, at the usual period of making County rates and levies, until the year 1846, inclusive, to add to the County rates and levics for the use of the Commonwealth as tollows: that is to say, upon all real and personal property now made taxable by the laws of this Commonwealth for the purpose of raising the County rates and levice, one mill upon every dollar of the actual value thereof: and upon all personal estate and property hereinafter, described owned or possessed by any person whatever, that is to say, on all mortgages, moneys at interest, debts due from solvent debtors, whether by prommissory note (except notes or bills for goods sold and delivered and bank notes,) penal or single bill, bond judgment, and all stock or shares owned or held he individuals in this Commonwealth in any bank, institation, or company, incorporated by any other state or territory, on all loans or investments on interest to citizens of other states, or in the securities of other states, owned or held by individuals in this Common wealth, and on all public loans or stocks whatsoever except those issued by this Commonwealth, owned or held as aforesaid, one half mill on every dollar of the value therof on which one per cent. per annum dividend or profit may accrue to, or be received by, the owner or holder thereof, and an additional half mill on every dollar of the value thereof for every additional one per cent per annum of any interest, dividend, or profit, accrueing to, or received hy, such owner or holder. Upon all household furnitate, including gold and silver plate owned and kept for use by any person or persons, corporation of corporations, exceeding in value the sun of three hundred dollars, five thills upon every dol-lar of the value thereof on such excess. Upon pleasure carriages owned and kept for use one per cent. uppn every dollar of the value thereof. Upon watches owned and kept for use, as follows: that is to say, on gold lever, or other gold watches of equal value, each one dollar; upon every other description of gold watches, and upon silver lever watches, or other silver watches of like value, sev-'ty-five cents each; upon every other description of watches of the value of twenty dollars or upwards, fifty cents each."

Saffe Act. Section 4 .- " That the Assessors and Assistant Assessors of the city and county of Philadelphia, and the Assessors of the other counties of this Commonwealth, on the receipt of the precept asued by the County Commissioners, shall proceed to ascertain the amount, description, and value of he several objects of taxation, before mentioned. Tecording; to the best information within their power, to be enquired for and obtained by them, and shall make out a full statement thereof, and make of the same to the County Commissioners, and if in any case, they shall fell to obtain a cor-rect or special description, they shall return the aggregate value thereof as nearly as they can ascertain the same, and, in all cases, the estimate of the Assessor, when practicable; shall be made as they would appraise the same in payment of a Sust deht from a solvent debtor."

Act presed on the 15th May, 1841, Section

From and after the passage of this Act it shall he the duty of the several Assessors and Assistant. Assessors to assess, rate, and value all objects of taxation; whether for state, county, city, district, ward, township, or burough purposes, according to the actual value thereof, and at such rates and prices for which the same would reperately bona

Same Act, Section 5 - " If the several Assessors of this Commonwealth in the discharge of their respective duties shall have reason to believe any per son or persons or corporation shall have rendered a son or persons or corporation shall have rendered a false return of his, her, or their property, trade, profession, occupation, or any article made taxable by law, or shall not make a full disclosure of the same, the said Assessors shall return what they believe to be, the full value and amount thereof to the Commissioners of the proper county, and if the person or persons or emporations thus assessed, shall feel aggrieved, an appeal may be had, according to the existing law, from such assensment and it shall be lawfel for the County Commission ers to administer an onth or affirmation to the person or persons, or corporation taking such appeal, touching the value and amount of their property, trade-occupation or profession, or any article made taxable, and if they deem an abatement proper, the same shall be made—but the commissioners may if they see proper, receive other evidence."

Same Act, Section 7.—So much of the Act passed on the 11th day of June. 1840, "as authorized the deduction of the value of any ground rent, dower, or mortgage, on any real estate within this Commonwealth, in estimating the value thereof, is hereby repealed, and said real estate shall hereafter be estimated at its full value, and taxed accord-Act passed on the 30th day of April; 1841; Section

9 .- There shall be annually assessed and collected on persons, trades occupations and professions a tax of one per cent on every dollar of the value thereof above two hundred dollars," and "there shall be annually assessed and collected upon all salaries and emoluments of office created or held by or under the constitution of laws of this Commonwealth; or by or under any incorporation, institution or company incorporated by the said Commonwealth; where such salaries or emoluments ex ceed two hundred dollars, which said taxes shall be assessed, collected, and accounted for in the manner and for the purposes stated and provided in the act of 11th June, 1840. Provided, That when the salary is paid to any officer of this Commonwealth directly by the State Treasurer, he shall retain out of said salary the amount of the tax imposed by this act."
