THE COAL TRADE. to the sale. October 15, Freight has advanced to 90 cents to Philadelphi and \$2,50 to New York. Our attention has been called to an article which recently appeared in the Ledger on the subject of the supply of coal, which, like nearly all the articles on the subject of the coal, trade emanating from that quarter, are for some cause or other, written express-ly to deceive the public.
