The Twenty-Eighth Congress.

The XXVIIIth Congress assembled in the Capitol at Washington on Monday, the 4th of December. The change in its composition from that of the last is probably greater than at any time since the passage of the famous Compromise Act in 1850.

Eleven out of Fifty-four Members of the Senate, and One Hundred and Sixty-four out of the Two Hundred and Twelve Representatives were not in the last, though some of them have been Members of preceding Congresses.

We do not think the new Congress compares advantageously with several of its predecessors. The loss of such men as Clay, Webster, Calhoun, and Fillmore, would be felt by any Legislative body.
