The amount of tolls received from the Public Works during the year was \$1,017,841 12, being an increase over last year of \$77,027 43 .-He states that he disapproved of the Bill author. izing a sale of the Public Works-but if the Legislature passes another Bill sufficiently guarded, he will sign it. We hope they may do so.

The Message speaks strongly against Repudiation-refers to two former Messages on the sub. ject of Banks. It shows that the sum paid out for School

Purposes, during the last three years amounts to \$1,089,832 83, while the whole State Tax during the same period received into the Treasury. amounted to only \$1,083,400.

With respect to the Relief Issues, the Message states that if the Loan requiring \$100,000 to be cancelled monthly, is continued in-force, the interest cannot be met in August, as the principal receipts into the Treasury, will be of this kind of funds.

He recommends again a re-organization of the Militia System, which has proved a burthen on the Treasury during the last year of \$42,448 59. He refers to the election of Printers, and gives


