"Cucambers were lso planted in the earth, (prepared as above by the Marquis of Anglesea) and a shock passes through each hill; on the following afternoon three out of four, hills were up and all on the next morning, with most of the seed leaves open; by the eleventh day the plants had two rough leaves. They were again treated with sulphuric acid in water, (one ounce to the gallon ;) on the 21th day pure water was used upon them, as they were beginning to open their blossoms. Silent shocks were several times afterwards passed thro' the hills. The first few blossens were all males; no fruit blossoms appeared till the twenty eighth day. On the thirty-seventh day after planting, two cucumbers, on the hill which received the last charge, were cut and eaten being five inches long, and one inch and a hulf is diamater. The writer adds that "during his abance, his boys had taken the other hills under their charge, and, in the course of their quick and ghergelie treatment . they were all killed." · A week or two since, we puffished an account of a method of applying a constant galvanic battery to beds of plants, with a diagram. This season (1844) my only experiment has been with pitatoes,' says the writer, 'and the electricity used is generated by different means from the otheis, which, until the discovery of Mr. Bain, was not adapted for the practical farmer.' . Then follows the description, which we published a week or two since, The potatoes were planted in drills, on the 6th of May ; they were hoed once only, and, from circumstances not mintioned, were not earthed up. Three rows only were under the influence of the battery, from which; on June 15th, potatoes were taken with the ingers, varying in diameter from an inch to an inch and a quarter, and on the second of July, some potatoes were taken from the same rows, about two and a half inches in diameter. EDITORS :- A friend of mine has just informed me of the success his has met with, by the application of charcoal to his yeach trees. A few years ago he had some fine trees in his garden, which invariably had wormy fruit ; and the trees full of gum ; when the fuit was about the size of marbles, he had the carth removed from

each tree about 2 feet around and 2 inches deep, and filled it up with charcoast the result was that the fruit grew to a full size free from worms; and every year since, the fruit has been good, and the became healthy and free from gum ; while two trees left without the charcoal, continue to bear wormy truit, and the trees unhealthy.

If farmers will plant their pumpkins, melons and other vines on land that brought corn the past year, they will never be toubled with the striped bug. This course has been particed here for ma-ny years, and has always proved successfier, when vies planted on land that mill another crop, even vines the year previous, are destroyed by me bug.
