

From the Farmers' Cabinet. AMATEUR FARMING. To the Editor :-- If you think the following

observations worth it, you can give them a place in your paper, which you publish not only for the meredian of Philadelphia, but also for the humble cottager among our mountains who has to carn his bread by the sweat of his brow, and who eagerly seeks in it what is really gerful, and I must say, often finds it, though we sometimes meet the effusions of gentlemen, who have filled their purses by mercantile speculations, and then retreat to agriculture for the benefit of their health. They tell us of their operations, which may have turned out like that of the Indian's gun, which cost more than it came to. With pleasure we see in the June number of the Cabinet, that the Phila delphia Agricultural Society have passed that very judicious resolution, that the applicants for the remium for the best farm, must answer questions as respects expenditures and profits. A strict account current, showing a balance of profit, would be an interesting document for our practical farm. er. The wealthy gentlemen who follow agriculture more for pleasure than for profit, ought to stand on higher ground, than merely to tell us how many sugar beets they can raise : we want to know whether they raise them to profit. Let them be liberal in making experiments, which their money enables them to do; for example—on the influence of electricity on agriculture, and let them give us a minute detailed report of their pro-

ccedings, then they will confer a real benefit to their brother farmers. Another matter of regret is, that so many wealthy nen cling to the large cities, proculating in stocks, having notes, &c., instead of promoting agriculure with liberality, like men of wealth in England lo; we would not then have been obliged to look to that country, with all its pompous names of pedigree, in its genealogical herd book, &c., to im-

rove our breed of cattle. It is now a fact known by overy practical farmer, that if our domestic breed were so well nursed and cross-breeded and every thing done to develope the organs that produce milk; they would be as good as the English breed. Many farmers from the interior, who have paid enormous prices for Durham or Devonshire cattle, now find that being reduced to the same treatment as our doinestic cattle, are no better than they. The farmer beng obliged to barter his butter for store goods to the country merchant, at seven or eight cents a pound, it would be too expensive to keep addition. al hands on the farm to curify and nurse the cattle. The butcher will inform you that he prefers for slaughtering, the cattle from the western part

of New York to the imported freed. If what I state is not so, I wish to be corrected by the farmer who operates or making profits, not by the wealthy amateur who merely farms to lay out his money. H. S.

If properly managed, and brought to market in first rate order, and a first rate article, it never need be sold in this market for soven or eight cents—it will readi-

A Yankee in a recent Buffalo paper, recomends the manufacture of 'Canvasback Ducks' out of the common duck, by feeding them with garden celery while fattening There is no sort of doubt that if this species of food be given them for some weeks before they are killed, they will have the flavor of it in their flesh, and perhaps be equal to; or better than the famous Canvasbacks above alluded to. It is an experiment very easily tried, and one which will no doubt be both successful and profitable.—Maine Farmer.

Four for Cows .- M. Chabert, the director of the veterinary school of Alford, England, had a number of cows which yieldell twelve gallons of milk every day. In his publication on the subject. he observes that cows, fed in the winter on dry substances, give less milk than those which are kept on a green diet, and also that their milk loses nuch of its quality. He published the following receipe, by the use of which his cows afforded him an equal quantity and quality of milk during the vinter as during the summer. Take a bushel of ootatoes, break them whils raw, place them in a barrel standing up, putting in successively a layer of bran, and a small quantity of yeast in the middle of the mass, which is to be left thus to ferment during a whole week, and, when the vinous taste has pervaded the whole mixture, it is then given to the cows, who eat it greedily .- Maine Cultivator.
