For the first time in fifteen years, New Hampshire has elected a Whig Governor. The manœuvre which has led to this change is curious. It may be remembered that John P. Hale was repudiated by the party in consequence of his refusal to vote for the annexation of Texas; in the next canvass he started as an independent candidate, and succeeded in defeating the nominee of the Locofoco party, there being no election. At the last election, the choice devolved on the Legislature which chose a Whig, Mr. Colby, Governor. Hale was elected to the U. S. Senate for two years, while Col. Gilley has been chosen in place of Jenness, appointed pro tem. Col. Gilley we learn is a Whig, and as he takes his seat immediately, this election makes a gain of two votes in favor of the Tariff in the Senate.

Mexico.—Latest news has been received from Mexico, via Havana, by the schooner Merchants at Charleston, S. C. It brings dates from Vera Cruz to June 1st.

The Consuls of the different neutral Nations have protested against the blockade of Vera Cruz. The population of that city are rapidly leaving. Congress was to meet on the 27th, but afterwards having been appointed its President. He will march in person to Matamoros at the head of a strong army composed of the Reserve Regulars, leaving Bravo President ad interim. Speculation was suspended and business was dull. The expectation of procuring funds from the clergy had failed.

The situation of our squadron with regard to the English is considered dangerous. It is said on the declaration of war, the whole Pacific coast will be occupied by the British Army. If so, it will not be without a struggle. Com. Sloat has a strong force with him, and when joined by Stockton, will attempt to hold his own.

THE IRON TRADE.—A valuable Report was received yesterday, very ably abridged, and in a pamphlet form, by the Iron Trade of the State, made by a Committee consisting of Messrs. Thomas Chambers, Doct. George N. Eckert, and Samuel J. Keeler, and Iron Association of Pennsylvania. The pamphlet consists of upwards of 30 pages, and embraces a list of all the Furnaces, Forges, and Rolling Mills in the State, together with their annual production. Our limits will not permit us to give any extended extracts from this Report, but we will give a few of the most interesting facts in the following terms in the aggregate:

Up to 1812, was 213, of which were Anthracite, capable of producing 189,550 Tons of Pig Metal.

Aggregate capital, 14,669,818.

This is certainly a prodigious increase since 1812, and great for the short time stated. It is beyond their comprehension, therefore the Tariff must be destroyed, and the business crushed.

POSTSCRIPT!—The Secretary of the Treasury has issued orders to the officers of the customs, to grant clearances to Matamoros, thus opening the market of the Northern Provinces of Mexico to American manufactures free of duty.

The supplementary army bill passed the Senate by a vote of 32 to 19, all the eyes being Locofoco, and no Whigs.

Gen. Gaines is at Washington seemingly free and at large.

The treaty has been ratified by the Senate. The date of its ratification is estimated at 49 to 11, and 39 to 14. The seal of secrecy has not been removed. So this terminates all danger of a war with England.

John K. Kane has been confirmed by the Senate as Judge of the U. S. District Court of the Eastern District of Pennsylvania.
