-----THE GREATEST GUN EVER CAST VET .--- The Boston Post says :--- Vesterday afternoon another stupendou's piece of ordnance, was cast at Algier's Foundry, South Boston, which, when finished. will exceed Capt. Stockton's celebrated "Peace Maker" by 5060 pounds in weight. The arrangements for the operation were commenced in the morning, by filling the furnaces with metal and tiring up. The quantity of meral used was 46,000 pounds, and the amount of coal used in redecing. it to the required state of fusion was eight chaldrams.

The weight of the gun, when finished, will be 25,000 pounds. Length, ten feet; dameter at the base ring, 39 inches; tength of chamber, 13 inches; diameter of chumber, 9 inci e- ; length of bore 9 feet I mah; diameter of bore, 12 incase. Weight, of round shot which it will carry, 230 pounds ; weight of shell 180 pounds.
