THE STEAMBOAT, MOUNT VERSON .- We'neticed in our paper some two weeks since, the arrival of the Mount Vernon at the place. We learn that on her return trip to Pailadelphis with the Managers of the Schuylkill Navigation Company Steel, English Blister, American Blister, German Steel, Spring Steel, &c., &c. 26on board, she ran the whole distance from Mount Carbon to the city (106 miles.) in 33 hours 55 minutes, running time.
