

LIME ON APPLE THELS .- An old farmer of such discrimination observed to us recently, that he had made it a regular practice for several years, to sow causic lime around his apple trees in the Spring. He had noticed that a tree standing in the immediate vicinity of his dwelling, had all at once put forth with renewed energy, and was at a loss for some time to know the cause. On inquiry, he found that a quantity of hime which had accidently been spilled and rendered worthless by becoming mixed with the refuse on the stable-floor. had been thrown at the foot of the tree, and to this as the principal cause, he immediately assigned the revivisence and renewed fructification of the tree. Taking the hint from this accident, he purchased twelve casks of sinne, and applied half a bushel to each tree, and found that it produced immediately beneficial effects. Not the health of

the trees only, but the quality of the fruit also was greatly improved. We would advise our readers a make a trial of this experiment and see whether it is deserving of the high secommendation it receives.—Maine Cultivator. The rows and hills were each four feet spart. The ground selected was, as near as I could judge, of the same quality; if there was any difference, it was in favor of that part not minured. The soil was a light nucaceous loun, but quite thin as you will see by the yield. It came up finely; the corn on the part, that was manuzed, grew vigorously keeping far ahead of the other, throughout the season, and ripening at least one week earlier. When har-vested, the part that was manured, yielded thirtys three baskets of carse making 16 bushels of shelled corn, and the other half only 17 baskets or 8 bushels-leaving me 8 bushels of sound corn to pay for the pondrette.
