Important from Vera Cruz!!

WATER AND SUPPLIES CUT OFF FROM THE ENEMY!!

Through the politeness of Mr. Keely, Conductor of the Rail Road, we have received a extra following intelligence:

The brig Fortia arrived at New Orleans on the 25th, from Sacrifices, bringing the 15th containing important intelligence from the force operating against Vera Cruz.

Troops were landed on the 7th, after a reconnaissance by the Generals with their Aids and the Topographical Corps. The guns of San Juan de Ulloa opening a fire of shell and round shot, but without harm to the party.

Twelve thousand troops were landed on the 9th, and took their line of march for the position assigned them.

A fire of shell and round shot was opened from the steamer Vixen and Spittler, which was returned by the Castle, without effect.

Gen. Worth's division landed and in taking his position on the 10th, after a spirited resistance on the enemy's part, the latter was driven back. On the 11th, Capt. Alburquerque of the 15th was killed with six others.

The troops took position to the left and rear of the Castle, and the latter was completely surrounded.

The water pipes leading from the tanks to the castle were broken, cutting off the supply of water to the garrison. The water in the tanks was completely exhausted.

The city is now so closely besieged that every communication with the interior is cut off, and there can be no doubt that long ere this both the castle and the city are in possession of our troops.

There has been considerable skirmishing to day and some twenty of our men wounded, among them Col. Dickson of South Carolina. The loss to the enemy is also considerable.

Three hundred and thirty men were taken prisoner, among them some of the best officers of the army.

The British Major Col. Smith had been taken prisoner by the Mexicans, and was being held in a cage.

It would take a page of our paper to give full details of the operations of our troops on the 12th, but it is sufficient to say that our position is now completely secure.

The general impression seems to be that the city will surrender in the course of ten days or two weeks. No doubt is expressed of the successful termination of the enterprise.

The Coal Trade for 1847.

The quantity sent by Rail Road from the week ending on 15th inst. - 13,965 1/2 tons - making the total sent by Rail Road the present season 215,817 1/2 tons.

The Canal is now navigable throughout the whole line, and up to yesterday about 2000 tons of Coal had been shipped to market.

The freights to New York on large boats is \$1.60 and on small boats \$1.70 per ton; to Philadelphia, 60 cents as present - the toll for the month of April is 45 cents - making the total cost of delivering a ton of Coal at Philadelphia by Canal, \$1.05.

Vessels continue as ever as far as Richmond, and until the quantity of Coal accumulated there is shipped off, we can furnish no regular quotation of prices on board - The great demand for breadstuffs in Europe and the number of vessels required, at present, to furnish our army in Mexico with supplies, is seriously affecting the domestic coal trade.
