WORK FOR APRIL.-THE GARDEN.-The time has now arrived when the Garden may be looked after; the fences repaired; the mounds of cartn used in burying vegetables, eveled; discarded vegetables, cabbage stalks, kc. removed: straw manure rakedoff and taken to the barnyard; trees and shrubbers trimmed, and grafting done; rose bushes thinned out and neatly tied, and a general clearing off attended to. An early bed of salad should should be put in; also early press, and notations don now he also early peas and potatoes can now be planted.— There is nothing like taking time by the forelock even in garden culture.-Ger. Tele-

raph. The following named vegetables should receive immediate attention: Peas.—If you have not already sown your early peas, for the table, and for market, be stir yourself and get them in without delay.

Cabbages.—As soon as you can prepare a lant bed; do so, and sow the various kinds f cabbage seed, both early, and late. Early potatoes may now be sown.

Celery.-The seed of this fine vegetable hould be sown immediately.

Peppers.—Seeds of this must be sown, so s to have plants ready for transplantation

Onions, garlie, leeks, chives, shallots, parsley, thyme, sage, summer savora, in fine, all the pot and medicinal herbs must ow be sown or planted out. Radishes.—Sow radishes immediately, and continued to do so every week for weeks

o come. Tomatoes and Egg Plants.—Sow the seeds of these as early as possible.

PREPARATION FOR SPRING WHEAT .- Mr. Q. C. Rich, Chairman of the Committee on Field Crops for the Addison County (Vt.,) Agricultural Society, makes the following remarks in reference to the cultivation of wheat: "Wheat and Corn, we think, will be admitted to be the two most important grains grown in this county. Winter and Spring wheat has paid a fair profit for the outlay the past season, particularly winter, which has not been better in twenty years. The best preparation is a clover tay, but in case you have none, we would recommend plowing your land early in June and sowing from one o two and a half bushels of Buckwheat percre, to be turned under the last of August or

irst of September. The rapid decomposition of the vegetable matter warms the soil and makes it thore friable—causes the wheat to vegetate, grow, and get a stronger growth—the roots to strike deeper than they would had you applied manure, or summer fallowed, as was the usual practice. The Black Sea (a spring variety,) s the only kind sown to any extent at this ime. When it was first introduced into the county three-fourths to one bushel was conidered sufficient to seed an acre; but now many are using two bushels: one and a half s believed to be preferable."


