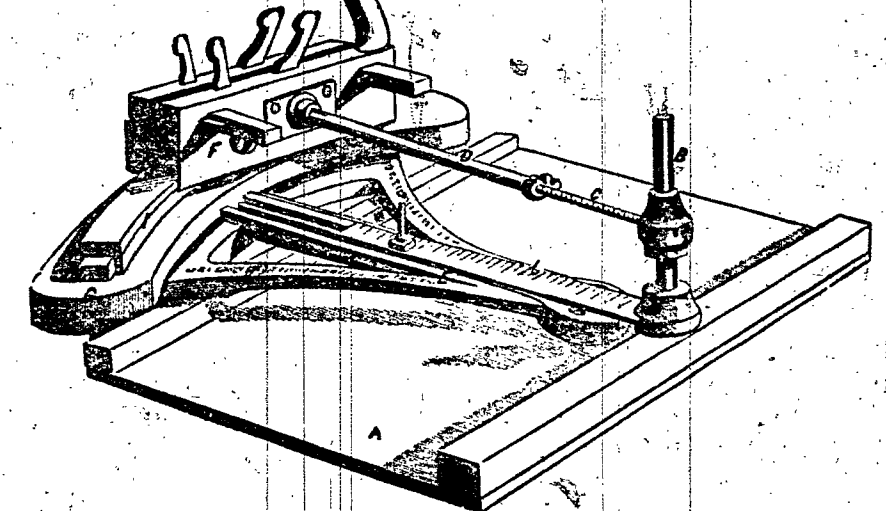

NEW MODE OF CUTTING WAGON FELLETS.
Neither by Hand or other Power.
No machine for planing out wagon fellets of different sizes and shapes has ever been constructed to operate with such success as the one illustrated by the above engraving. Mr. Johnson has just received the exclusive right to his invention from the patent agents Messrs. Fowler and Wells of New York.

The difficulties heretofore experienced in cutting fellets of different sizes and shapes, and the size and depth of the fellet which is desired to cut, in a very perfect manner, is the object of the present invention. It is a stationary upright guide, upon which the hub turns

which holds the rod, C, passing into and adjustable within the tube, D, the tube, D being made fast to the plane, E, as represented.

The felly, I, is made fast to the adjustable bar, G, which is also adjustable with the center pin, B, by means of the bar, I, sliding within the channel of the felly, and the frame attached to the bar, G. A clutch upon the top of H, firmly in place, except voluntarily moved and set by the graduated screw, J, which is also adjustable with the felly.

Fellets for carriages are planed very rapidly by this machine, and the work is of quality superior to that of any other power required; but the engraving represents a hand-plane. Most wagon-makers will use this kind for ordinary work, as it is more easily constructed. Further information may be obtained by addressing the inventor at Chester, Pa.
